- 3. Institution must have a letter of review through CAAHEP.
- 4. In narrative form, outline how you plan to verify and track student's competency in:
 - No fewer than fifty (50) attempts at airway management across all age levels, with a ninety percent (90%) success rate utilizing endotrachael intubation in the last ten (10) attempts.
 - Must be one hundred percent (100%) successful in the management of the last twenty (20) attempts at airway management.
 - Clinical experience must include the operating room, recovery room, Intensive Care Unit (ICU), coronary care
 department, labor and delivery room, pediatrics, and Emergency Room (ER).
 - All students must have adequate exposure, as determined by the program medical director and advisory committee, to pediatric, obstetric, psychiatric, and geriatric patients.
 - All students must complete a Field Internship and successfully manage, assess, and treat patients. Minimum Team
 Leads must be established by the program medical director and advisory committee and be completed by every
 student.
