### Use Your Local Library, Post Office or **District Office**

Tax forms may be available in your neighborhood at your local library or post office. They are also available at any of our district offices, which are located in Bloomington, Clarksville, Columbus, Evansville, Fort Wayne, Kokomo, Lafayette, Merrillville, Muncie, South Bend and Terre Haute. These offices are open Monday through Friday between 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Check local listings for the address, or visit our Web site at www.in.gov/dor/contact/ district.html

## **Need Help With Your Return?**

### **Use Local Assistance**

For help, visit any of the Department's district offices or take advantage of the IRS Volunteer Return Preparation Program (VRPP). This program offers free tax return help to low income, elderly and special needs individuals. Volunteers will fill out federal and state forms for those who qualify. Call the IRS at 1-800-829-1040 to find the nearest VRPP location. Be sure to take your W-2s, 1099s and/or WH-18s with you. If you are going to a district office, also take a copy of your completed federal tax return.

### **Use the Automated Information Line**

Call the automated information line at (317) 233-4018 to get the status of your refund, billing information and prerecorded tax topics. These topics include collection procedures, business registration requirements, payment plan procedures, estimated tax procedures, underpayment of estimated tax penalty, use tax, county tax, and 2006 tax year highlights. If you wish to check billing information, be sure to have a copy of your tax notice. The system will ask you to enter the tax identification number or Social Security number shown on the notice.

## Ready To File Your Return?

### **Use the Electronic Filing Program**

Over 1.3 million Hoosier taxpayers used the Electronic Filing Program to file their 2005 state and federal individual income tax returns. Electronic filing provides Indiana taxpayers the opportunity to file their federal and state tax returns immediately and receive their Indiana refunds in about half the time it takes to process a paper return. It takes even less time if you use direct deposit, which deposits your refund directly into your bank account. Even if there is an amount due on either return, Indiana taxpayers can still file electronically and feel comfortable knowing that the returns were received by the IRS and the Indiana Department of Revenue. Contact your tax preparer to see if he/she provides this service.

### I-File

This fast, friendly and free electronic program allows taxpayers to prepare and file state tax returns using the Internet. A user-friendly program, I-File features a question-and-answer format and help links to guide users through filing. For more information and to take advantage of this free service, please visit our Web site at www. ifile.in.gov

### **Our Web Site**

Our Web site contains tax filing options, a Spanish version of the IT-40 booklet with forms, downloadable blank forms and instructions, information bulletins, commissioner's directives, an online helpdesk, helpful e-mail links and a calendar with filing due dates. ### Where's Your Refund?

There are several ways to check the status of your refund. You will need to know the exact whole-dollar amount of your refund, and a Social Security number entered on your tax return. Then, do one of the following.

- Call (317) 233-4018 for automated refund information.
- Go to www.in.gov/dor/individual/maintenance.html and click on the words "Look up the status of your refund online".
- Call (317) 232-2240 from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday Friday, and a representative will help you.

A refund directly deposited to your bank account may be listed on your bank statement as a credit, deposit, etc. If you have received information from the Department that your refund has been issued, and you are not sure if it has been deposited in your bank account, call the ACH Section of your bank or financial institution for clarification.

**Note:** A refund deposited directly to your Hoosier MasterCard Account will appear on your account monthly statement.

### Moving?

If you move to a new address after filing your tax return and do not have a forwarding address on file with the post office, the Department needs to know where to send your refund check. Change your address with us by doing one of the following:

- Go to www.in.gov/dor/individual/maintenance.html and click on the words 'change your mailing address'.
- Call the Department at 317-232-2240.
- Call or visit a district office near you.

## **Before You Begin**

Important: Complete your federal tax return first.

Please use ink.

### Filling in the Boxes

If you are handwriting letters and numbers in the boxes, please print your letters and numbers neatly. Make sure there is only one letter or number in each box.

## Social Security Number (SSN)

Be sure to enter your SSN in the boxes at the top of the form. If filing a joint return, enter your SSN in the first set of boxes and your spouse's SSN in the second set of boxes. An incorrect or missing SSN can increase your tax due, reduce your refund or delay timely processing of your filing.

## Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN)

If you already have an ITIN, enter it wherever your Social Security number is requested on your tax return. If you are in the process of applying for an ITIN, check the box located directly beneath the SSN area at the top of the form . For information on how to get an ITIN, contact the Internal Revenue Service at 1-800-829-3676 and request federal Form W-7, or find it online at www.irs.ustreas.gov/pub/irs-pdf/fw7.pdf

### Name and Address

The first Form IT-40EZ in this booklet may have your name(s) and address already filled in. If any of the information is incorrect, don't use that form. Instead, print the correct information on the second Form IT-40EZ in the booklet and use it to file.

### P.O. Box

Enter your box number instead of your street address only if your post office does not deliver mail to your home.

### **Refund Check Address**

Your refund check will be issued in the name(s), address and Social Security number(s) shown on your tax return. It is very important that this information is correct and legible. Any wrong information will delay your refund.

### **Foreign or Military Addresses**

The U.S. Post Office requires that the full foreign-country name appear in all addresses. Standard two-character abbreviations for Canadian provinces and territories should be entered in the "State" area on the tax return.

Overseas military addresses must contain the APO, FPO designation in the "city field" along with a two-character "state" abbreviation of AE, AP, or AA and the zip code. Place these two- and three-letter designations in the city name area.

### **School Corporation Number**

Enter the four-digit school corporation number (found on pages 10 or 11) for where the primary taxpayer lived on January 1, 2006. The primary taxpayer is the first name listed at the top of the tax return. If the primary taxpayer did not live in Indiana on January 1, 2006, enter the code number "9999". Contact a local school or your county auditor's office if you're not sure which school corporation you live in.

It is important that you enter the correct school corporation number. This information is used for statistical tracking purposes to determine possible school funding needs and changes.

**Note:** If the school corporation number is not entered, the processing of your return will be delayed.

## **County Information**

Enter the two-digit code numbers for the county(s) where you and your spouse, if filing joint, lived and worked on January 1, 2006. You can find these code numbers on the chart on page 6 in the column titled County Code #. See the instructions beginning on page 8 for more information, including the definitions of the county where you live and work.

## **Attaching W-2s and Enclosing Checks and Forms**

Staple your W-2s, 1099s, and/or WH-18s under line 1 on the front of Form IT-40EZ. To help us process your form please make sure these attachments don't cover the county box information above line 1 or the boxes at the bottom of the form under line 18.

## **Line-By-Line Instructions**

Important: Complete Your Federal 1040EZ First.

## Please round your amounts to the nearest whole dollar.

To do this, drop amounts of less than \$0.50. Example. \$432.49 rounds down to \$432.00.

Increase amounts of \$0.50 or more to the next higher dollar. Example. \$432.50 rounds up to \$433.00.

#### Line 1

Enter your federal "adjusted gross income" from federal Form 1040EZ, line 4.

#### Line 2

Enter the amount from line 3 of the Indiana Deduction Worksheet from the back of Form IT-40EZ.

#### Line 3

Subtract any line 2 deduction(s) from the amount on line 1. If the answer is less than zero, leave the line blank.

#### Line 4

Exemptions: Enter \$1,000 if filing a single return and \$2,000 if filing a joint return. Note: You are always eligible to claim a full \$1,000 personal exemption on your Indiana IT-40EZ (even if your parents or someone else can also claim you on their return).

#### Line 7

Complete the County Tax Worksheet on page 5. Add the amounts on the worksheet from Section 1, line 4 and Section 2, line 6 and enter the total here.

### Line 8 - Use Tax Due on Out-of-State Purchases

If, while a resident of Indiana, you made purchases outside Indiana by mail order, through radio or television advertising, over the Internet or directly from an out-of-state company, those purchases may be subject to Indiana sales and use tax if sales tax was not paid at the time of purchase. This tax, called "use" tax, is figured at 6 percent (.06).

When you make purchases from a company in Indiana, that company is responsible for collecting the Indiana sales tax from you. When you make purchases from an out-of-state company, YOU are responsible for making sure the use tax is paid. Either the out-of-state company collects the tax from you or you must pay the tax directly to the State of Indiana.

Complete the worksheet on page 4 to figure your tax. If you paid sales tax to the state where the item was originally purchased you are allowed a credit against your Indiana use tax for an amount up to 6 percent (.06).

## Lines 10 and 11 - Indiana State and County Tax Withholding Amounts

Enter the amount(s) of Indiana state and/or county tax withheld, which is usually shown in boxes 17 and 19 of your W-2s. You must attach your W-2s to verify your claimed withholding.

### Line 12 - Indiana's Earned Income Credit

Most Hoosiers who claim the earned income credit on their federal Form 1040EZ are now eligible to claim Indiana's earned income credit.

If vou:

- Were a full-year Indiana resident during 2006,
- Had income from Indiana sources, and
- Claimed at least a \$9\* earned income credit on your federal Form 1040EZ, then

you are eligible to claim Indiana's earned income credit.

Complete the worksheet on the back of Form IT-40EZ to figure your credit.

\*This amount must be \$9 or more (a smaller federal earned income credit will result in an Indiana credit of less than \$1).

**Important:** If you received Indiana advance earned income credit payments from your employer, then you <u>cannot</u> file Form IT-40EZ; you must file Form IT-40 and report this amount on line 20 of that form.

### Line 15 - Contribution to Indiana Nongame Wildlife Fund

The Indiana Wildlife Diversity Section offers you the opportunity to play an active role in conserving Indiana's nongame and endangered wildlife. This program is funded through public donations to Indiana's Nongame Fund. The money you donate goes directly to the protection and management of more than 750 wildlife species in Indiana - from songbirds and river otters to state-endangered bald eagles and spotted turtles.

Enter the amount of your refund you wish to donate to the Nongame Wildlife Fund on line 15. You can donate all or a part of your refund. Donations must be a minimum of \$1.


If you are not receiving a refund, but want to support the Wildlife Diversity Section, do not change your tax return. You can send a donation directly to the Nongame Fund by completing the form on the back of this booklet.

### **Line 17 - Direct Deposit**

If you want your refund directed into your bank account, complete lines 17a, b and c.

- a) The routing number is 9 (nine) digits, with the first two digits of the number beginning with 01 through 12 or 21 through 32. Do not use a deposit slip to verify the number because it may have internal codes as part of the actual routing number. The sample check below has the routing number identified.
- b) The account number can be up to 17 digits. Omit any hyphens, accents and special symbols. Enter the number from left to right and leave any unused boxes blank. The account number is identified on the sample check below.
- c) Check the appropriate box for the type of account you are making your deposit to: either a checking account or savings account.



Note: The routing and account numbers may appear in different places on your checks.

If you currently have a **Hoosier Works MasterCard** and wish to have your refund directly deposited in your account, enter your 12-digit account number on line 17b, where it says "Account Number" (**do not** write anything on line 17a "Routing Number").

You can find your 12-digit account number in the upper right-hand corner of your account monthly statement.

Note: DO NOT use your MasterCard 16 digit number.

Make sure to check the "Hoosier Works MC" box on line 17c.

Keep a copy of your return and attachments for your records.

### Line 18 - Amount You Owe - Payment Options

There are several ways you can pay the amount you owe.

If sending a check, money order or cashiers check, make it payable to: Indiana Department of Revenue. Paperclip the payment to the bottom of the front of the return. If you don't have a paperclip, just include it loose in the envelope. Do not staple it to the return. Do not send cash.

**Note:** All payments made to the Indiana Department of Revenue must be made with U.S. funds.

You may pay the Amount You Owe on line 18 with a major credit card over the Internet or by phone. Log on to the Web site at www. in.gov/dor/epay, or call 1-888-829-3746 toll free, and use your American Express, Discover, MasterCard, or Visa. A convenience fee will be charged by the credit card processor based on the amount you are paying. You will be told what the fee is and you will have the option to either cancel or continue the credit card transaction.

You may also pay by the eCheck payment method, which uses a paperless check. This service may be used to pay the tax due with your Indiana individual income tax return, as well as any billings issued by the Indiana Department of Revenue for any tax type. Go to our Web site at <a href="https://www.in.gov/dor/epay">www.in.gov/dor/epay</a>, and follow the step-by-step instructions to make your payment. You will receive a confirmation number and should keep this with your tax filing records. The fee for using this service is \$1.

Note: No payment is due if you owe less than \$1.

**Note:** You may owe penalty and interest if you file past the April 16, 2007, due date. Also, if you owe more than \$400, a penalty for the underpayment of estimated tax may be due. We will bill you if any of these penalties or interest are due. You also have the option to file the IT-40(instead of Form IT-40EZ) and pay any penalties and interest due with that filing. See the "Need Tax Forms ...?" section on page 1 for options on how to get this form.

## Indiana Deduction Worksheet Instructions Located on Back of Form IT-40EZ

### Line 1 - Renter's Deduction

You may be able to take the renter's deduction if: a) you paid rent on your principal place of residence, and b) the place you rented was subject to Indiana property tax.

Your "principal place of residence" is the place where you have your true, fixed, permanent home and where you intend to return after being absent.

If you rented a mobile home or paid rent on a lot for your mobile home, you may claim the renter's deduction if the above requirements are met.

Rent paid for summer or vacation homes is not deductible.

You cannot claim the renter's deduction if the rental property was exempt from Indiana property tax. Examples of this type of property are:

- a) Government owned housing,
- b) Property owned by a nonprofit organization;
- c) Student housing;
- d) Property owned by a cooperative association; or
- e) Property located outside of Indiana.

The renter's deduction is the actual amount of rent paid or \$2,500, whichever is less. You must complete all the information on the worksheet. If you moved during the year or had more than one landlord, you must list the same information for each place that you rented. Attach additional sheets if necessary.

**Important:** You must maintain copies of your rental receipts, landlord identifying information, and lease agreements as the Department can require you to provide this information.

## **Line 2 - Nontaxable Portion of Unemployment Compensation**

If you received unemployment compensation during 2006, Indiana may tax a different amount than what you reported on your federal Form 1040EZ, line 3. Complete the worksheet below to detemine the amount of your deduction.

### **Unemployment Compensation Worksheet**

**Note:** If you were married but filing separately, and you lived with your spouse at any time during 2006 enter -0- on line 3 of the worksheet. However, if you were married but filing separately, and lived apart from your spouse the entire year, enter \$12,000 on line 3.

You'll need your federal Form 1040EZ to complete lines 1 and 2 below.  1. Enter the unemployment compensation from your federal Form 1040EZ, line 3	1	
2. Enter the "adjusted gross income" from your federal Form 1040EZ, line 4	2	
3. Enter \$12,000 if single, or \$18,000 if married filing a joint return	3	
4. Subtract line 3 from line 2. If zero or less, enter -0-	4	
5. Enter one-half (1/2) of the amount on line 4	5	
6. Taxable unemployment compensation for Indiana purposes: enter the amount from either		
line 1 or line 5, whichever is smaller	6	
7. Subtract line 6 from line 1. Carry this amount to the back of Form IT-40EZ. Enter it on		
line 2 of the Indiana Deduction Worksheet	7	

## **County Tax Worksheet Instructions**

If, on January 1, 2006, you and/or your spouse lived or worked in an Indiana county that had a county tax, then you must complete this worksheet. The counties that have a tax are listed on page 6 with their tax rates. Note: If the county on the chart has the initials "NA" in the rate columns, that means it doesn't have a county tax. Its name is listed there so you can find the two-digit code number for your county for the top of the IT-40EZ. Also, code number "00" is to be used by Indiana residents who worked out-of-state unless they live in the states listed in a box at the bottom of the chart on page 6.

### **County of Residence**

Your county of residence is the county where you maintained your home on January 1, 2006. If you had more than one home in Indiana on this date, then your county of residence as of January 1, 2006 was:

- a) Where you were registered to vote. If this did not apply, then your county of residence was:
- b) Where your personal automobile was registered. If this did not apply, then your county of residence was:
- c) Where you spent the majority of your time in Indiana during 2006.

If you moved to another Indiana county after January 1, 2006, your county of residence for tax purposes will not change until next year.

- If, on January 1, 2006, you lived in a county that has a tax, then
  you will owe county tax on all of your Indiana adjusted gross
  income.
- If, on January 1, 2006, you lived in a county that has no tax, then county tax will be figured on your income from your principal employment if the county where you worked on January 1, 2006, has a tax.

## **Special Note to Married Taxpayers Filing** a Joint Return

- If you lived in different counties on January 1, 2006, both of you need to figure your county tax separately on Section 1.
- If both of you lived in a county on January 1, 2006, that had no tax but worked in a county that did have a tax, you must figure your tax separately on Section 2.

## **Section 1 Instructions**

#### Line 1

- If you are filing a single return, enter on line 1A the amount from Form IT-40EZ, line 5.
- If you are filing a joint return and you both lived in the same county that has a tax on January 1, 2006 enter on line 1A the amount from Form IT-40EZ, line 5. Leave Column B blank.
- If you are filing a joint return and you lived in different counties on January 1, 2006, then enter your share of the income on line 5 of the IT-40EZ. See how to do this in Example 1 in the next column.

*Example 1-* On January 1, 2006, Jim and Rita lived in different counties. Their share of the income on line 5 of their IT-40EZ is figured in the following way:

Jim will enter \$21,290 on line 1A and Rita will enter \$19,290 on line 1B. (\* This is their IT-40EZ line 5 amount.)

### **County Where You Worked**

Your county of principal employment is the county where your main place of business was located or where your main work activity was performed on January 1, 2006. If you began working in another county after January 1, 2006, the county where you worked for tax purposes will not change until next year. If you had more than one job on January 1, 2006, your principal place of employment is the job where you worked the most hours and earned the most income.

*Example 2* - Jessie worked in Marion County on January 1, 2006. She quit that job and began a new one in Johnson County on February 10, 2006. She will enter the Marion County two-digit code (49) as the county where she worked for 2006 even though she changed jobs during the year.

### **Principal Employment Income**

You must figure your principal employment income if, on January 1, 2006, you lived in a county that didn't have a tax but worked in a county that did have a tax. You will be filling out Section 2 instead of Section 1. Your principal employment income is income you earned from your main work activity (job) for the entire year.

Example 3 - Jessie earned \$1,000 at her Marion County job from January 1 through February 2, 2006. She earned \$14,000 at her Johnson County job she began on February 10 and worked through year's end. Her principal employment income for the year subject to Marion county tax is \$15,000.

*Example 4 -* Steve earned \$15,000 from his full-time job. He also earned \$2,000 from a part-time job. If you work a part-time job and a full-time job at the same time, only the income earned from the job where you worked the most hours and made the most income will be principal employment income subject to tax. Steve's principal employment income that is subject to county tax is \$15,000.

## **Additional Information**

### **Deceased Individual Information**

If the taxpayer and/or spouse died during 2006, and this return is being filed with his/her name on it, make sure to enter the month and day of death in the appropriate box located on the back of the IT-40EZ. For example, a date of death of January 9, 2006, would be entered as 01/09.

**Note:** If the taxpayer and/or spouse died before or after 2006, do not enter his/her date of death in this box.

### **Authorization Section**

If someone other than you completed this tax return, you can give the Department permission to discuss your tax return with that person. Place a checkmark in the appropriate box on the back of the tax return. Also, you must enter that person's identification number in the boxes provided at the end of this section. Enter the person's Social Security number, federal identification number or preparer's tax identification number (PTIN) if completed by a professional preparer. If someone other than you completed this return, and you do not want the Department to discuss your return with that person, check the "No" box.

### **Signature Section**

If this is a joint return, both you and your spouse must sign and date the tax return. Also, give us your daytime telephone number so we can call you if we have any questions about your tax return.

If a paid preparer completed this tax return for you, he/she must complete the paid preparer's signature section. The paid preparer must provide the name and address of the firm that he/she represents. Also, the preparer must sign and date the back of the tax return and provide his/her identification number (in the area below your signature). We also ask for the daytime telephone number of the preparer if you authorize us to discuss your tax return with the preparer.

### Signing the decedent's tax return

If a joint return is filed by the surviving spouse, the surviving spouse should sign his/her name and after the signature write: "Filing as Surviving Spouse".

If filing a return for a deceased individual, an executor or administrator appointed for the deceased's estate must file and sign the return (even if this isn't the <u>final</u> return), indicating their relationship after their signature (e.g. administrator).

If an executor or administrator has not been appointed, the person filing the return should sign and give their relationship to the deceased (e.g. "John Doe, nephew").

### **Unresolved Problems?**

### **Use the Taxpayer Advocate**

As prescribed by the Taxpayer Bill of Rights, the Department has an appointed Taxpayer Advocate whose purpose is to facilitate the resolution of taxpayer complaints and complex tax issues. If you have a complex tax issue you must first pursue resolution through normal channels, such as contacting the Taxpayer Services Division (317-232-2240), Collection Division (317-232-2165), etc. If you are still unable to resolve your tax issue, or a tax assessment places an undue hardship on you, you may receive assistance from the Office of the Taxpayer Advocate.
