Campaign Finance Instructions for Democratic and Republican Party State Convention Candidates

A candidate's committee must file "quarterly" campaign finance reports with the Indiana Election Division, according to the following schedule. These filings must be made electronically. A person who fails to file a report with the Indiana Election Division is subject to a civil penalty of \$50 for each the report is late, with the afternoon of the final date for filing the report being calculated as the first day, for a maximum penalty of not more than \$1,000 plus any investigative costs incurred and documented by the Indiana Election Division. Contact the Campaign Finance Division of the Election Division for further information. The committee must file quarterly reports no later than noon, Indianapolis time:

- April 15, 2026, covering the period from January 1, 2026, through March 31, 2026. July 15, 2026, covering the period from April 1, 2026, through June 30, 2026.

- October 15, 2026, covering the period from July 1, 2026, through September 30, 2026. (3)
- October 27, 2026, covering the period from October 1, 2026, through October 19, 2026
- January 20, 2027, covering the period from October 20, 2024, through December 31, 2026.

The candidate's committee must also file supplemental reports with the Indiana Election Division no later than forty-eight (48) hours after the committee receives and accepts contributions from a person that total \$1,000 or more during the reporting periods listed below. If no such contribution is received and accepted, the candidate's committee is not required to file a supplemental report.

- Supplemental Reporting Period: April 1, 2026, through NOON April 15, 2026.
- Supplemental Reporting Period: July 1, 2026, through NOON July 15, 2026. (2)
- (3)Supplemental Reporting Period: October 1, 2026, through NOON October 15, 2026.
- Supplemental Reporting Period: October 20, 2026, through NOON October 26, 2026.

The candidate's committee must also file a supplemental report with the Indiana Election Division not later than noon seven (7) days after the committee receives a single contribution of at least \$10,000. This supplemental report must be filed at any time following receipt of this amount of contribution.

Campaign Finance Instructions for Libertarian Party Statewide Candidates

A candidate's committee must file "quarterly" campaign finance reports with the Indiana Election Division. These filings must be made electronically, and are subject to the same civil penalties, schedule and deadlines set forth above. Contact the Campaign Finance Division of the Election Division for further information. The candidate's committee must also file supplemental reports with the Indiana Election Division no later than forty-eight (48) hours after the committee receives and accepts contributions from a person that total \$1,000 or more during the reporting periods listed Above. If no such contribution is received and accepted, the candidate's committee is not required to file a supplemental

The candidate's committee must also file a supplemental report with the Indiana Election Division not later than noon seven (7) days after the committee receives a single contribution of at least \$10,000. This supplemental report must be filed at any time following receipt of this amount of contribution.

Campaign Finance Instructions for Libertarian Party State Convention Candidates

If a candidate becomes a candidate more than twenty-five (25) days before the convention, the candidate's committee must file a pre-convention campaign finance report no later than noon eighteen (18) days before the convention with the Indiana Election Division. If a candidate becomes a candidate less than twenty-five (25) days before the convention, the candidate must file a post-convention campaign finance report not later than noon twenty (20) days after the convention with the Indiana Election Division.

A candidate's committee must file a pre-election campaign finance report no later than NOON, Friday, October 16, 2026, with the Indiana Election Division. The candidate's committee must also file a pre-election supplemental report no later than forty-eight (48) hours after the committee receives and accepts contributions from a person that total \$1,000 or more during the period beginning October 10, 2026, and ending 6 a.m. November 1, 2026, with the Indiana Election Division. If no such contribution is received and accepted, the candidate's committee is not required to file a supplemental report.

A person who fails to file a report with the Indiana Election Division is subject to a civil penalty of \$50 for each calendar day the report is late, with the afternoon of the final date for filing the report being calculated as the first day, for a maximum penalty of not more than \$1,000, plus any investigative costs incurred and documented by the Election Division.
