Indiana Horse Racing Commission Quarantine Conditions & Policies

In order to place a horse in quarantine pursuant to 71 IAC 8-2-5 or 71 IAC 8.5-13-5, the undersigned must accept the following conditions and policies:

1. The cost of quarantine for the first twenty four (24) hours is \$240.00 or such amount as determined by the track to cover their costs. This amount must be paid by the undersigned to the track prior to quarantine. At the discretion of the Executive Director or the Judges/Stewards, quarantine may be extended up to a total of five (5) days. The undersigned agrees to promptly pay in advance for any extension of quarantine. The cost of the quarantine shall be refunded to the undersigned only in the event that the Executive Director or the Judges/Stewards determine that the horse in quarantine has normally high levels.
2. If after the first day of testing the results are within permitted levels as defined by Commission rules, (within non-scratch/non-disqualification levels) quarantine shall cease and the horse shall be deemed to have physiologically normal levels. The horse shall only be required to remain in quarantine for more than twenty-four (24) hours if the initial results are inconclusive or for any appropriate reason, as determined at the discretion of the Executive Director or the Judges/Stewards.
3. To the extent possible, quarantine shall begin in the evening on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday. Testing should begin the day **after** the horse is placed in quarantine and no sooner than twelve (12) hours after being placed in quarantine.
4. To the extent possible, the horse will receive furosemide in accordance with IHRC rules and procedures for race day furosemide administration. The horse will receive the same amount of furosemide as documented on the Security paperwork on the race day the high value occurred.
5. To the extent possible, the Commission shall run three tests each day, at reasonable intervals no less than one hour apart.
6. To the extent possible, the tests shall be run to coincide with the normal working hours of the veterinary technician and laboratory technician.

7. The owner, trainer or designated licensees may observe, but not interfere with, the drawing of blood and testing on the Blood Gas Analyzer (from outside the lab office).
8. The owner, trainer or designated licensees may, upon request, be given the results of the test as soon as they are available.
9. The owner, trainer or designated licensees may observe his/her horse in quarantine at any time.
10. The quarantined horse may be fed only hay, grain and water. The grain must be from an unopened bag which is opened in the presence of a Commission employee or track security. All feed and hay is subject to the inspection of Commission employees or track security. The trainer or designated licensees shall be responsible for the proper care of the horse, including watering and feeding the horse.
11. The horse in quarantine may exercise on the track. However, the Judges/Stewards must give prior approval for any such exercise. The Judges/Stewards may place any conditions upon such exercise as they deem prudent.
12. In order to demonstrate that the horse in quarantine has normally high levels, such horse must demonstrate continued and repeated high levels (as set forth in 71 IAC 8-2-2 or 71 IAC 8-13.5-2) throughout the period of quarantine.
