INSTRUCTIONS FALCONRY NOTIFICATION AND ACQUISITION REQUEST FORM

If you wish to trap a raptor from the wild in Indiana:

- 1) Fill out Sections A and B of the Falconry Notification and Acquisition Request Form and send to Indiana DNR prior to trapping bird.
- 2) After receiving the band and trapping the bird, report it electronically or send 1 completed copy of Federal Form 3-186A to Indiana DNR within 10 days of trapping bird.

If your raptor escapes or dies:

1) Within 30 days of a bird escaping or within 10 days of losing a raptor due to death or theft, report it electronically or send 1 completed copy of the Federal Form 3-186A to Indiana DNR. Note: If you wish to request a new band due to the loss of the raptor, fill out Sections A and B of the Falconry Notification and Acquisition Request Form and send to Indiana DNR. Follow the instructions for trapping a raptor from the wild.

If you need to request another band (due to lost band or current band being damaged/causing injury to bird):

- 1) Fill out Sections A and C of the Falconry Notification and Acquisition Request Form and send to Indiana DNR.
- 2) After receiving the band and banding the bird, report it electronically or send 1 completed copy of the Federal Form 3-186A to Indiana DNR within 10 days of banding.

If you wish to transfer your raptor to another falconer:

1) For a permanent transfer, both parties must report the transfer electronically or send 1 completed copy of the Federal Form 3-186A to Indiana DNR within 10 days of transferring bird.

If you wish to release your raptor:

- 1) Prior approval of the Indiana DNR is not required to intentionally release a bird that is native (breeding or naturally occurring) in Indiana. Species that can be released without prior approval are the following: Red-tailed hawk, Goshawk, Cooper's hawk, Sharp-shinned hawk, American Kestrel, Peregrine Falcon, Merlin and Great-horned Owl. All other species (not native) require Indiana DNR approval prior to intentional release.
- 2) Upon release of a native bird, report the Form 3-186A electronically or send 1 completed copy to the Indiana DNR within 10 days of releasing the bird.

- or -

- 3) Fill out Sections A and D of the Falconry Notification and Acquisition Request Form and send to Indiana DNR requesting approval to release a species not native to Indiana.
- 4) Then, IF release is approved, report the release electronically or send 1 completed copy of the Federal Form 3-186A to the Indiana DNR with the old band attached within 10 days of release.

If you wish to transfer a raptor from your Federal Raptor Propagation Permit to your Falconry License or vice versa:

1) Report the transfer electronically or send 1 copy of the Federal Form 3-186A to Indiana DNR within 10 days of transferring bird.
